#### Need an Official High School Transcript?

Fill out the <u>Transcript Request Form</u> in the RHS Counseling Center and submit to Ms. Palm *OR send your request to* <u>transcripts-rhs@lwsd.org</u>. Your transcript(s) will be ready within 24 hours. There is a one-time fee of \$10.

#### Where Should My Student Apply?

If a student is applying to a 4-year university, we recommend applying to 1-2 schools in each of the following categories:

**Safety** = your academic credentials fall WELL above the average range for freshman applying. Still, there are no guarantees.

**Match** = your credentials are at or exceed the average range for freshman applying. It's a good, competitive match for you.

**Dream School Reach** = your credentials fall short of the average range for freshman applying. It's a long shot you will get in...
