- <u>11th and 12th graders:</u> You may register to take the PSAT through Parent Access or with our bookkeeper. There will be a \$16 fee for the test.
 - 11th grade students: If you take the PSAT, your score will be considered for the National Merit Scholarship Competition.
 - 12th grade students: Please note that the PSAT is different from the SAT. If you are applying to colleges and need to take an admissions test, the PSAT is not a test that colleges will accept in the application process.

Enter Scholarship Competitions

By taking the PSAT/NMSQT and meeting published entry requirements, **juniors** can enter the National Merit Scholarship Program conducted by National Merit Scholarship Corporation. If you took the test as a sophomore, you need to take it again, as a junior. Only JUNIOR test scores are used for National Merit and possible scholarships! Students taking the exam now have increased access to nearly \$18 million in combined annual awards for low-income and minority students through leading scholarship providers. You should opt into Student Search Service when you take the PSAT/NMSQT to benefit from these opportunities.

Remember- The PSAT will be given only one time, Wednesday, October 10, 2018. The test fee is \$16 for juniors and seniors, free for sophomores. Juniors and seniors will sign up/pay with the RHS Bookkeeper no later than October 3, 2018. (Fee waivers are available for eligible juniors and seniors, such as those covered by free and reduced-price lunch programs. See your counselor in September if you qualify).
