Redmond High School is located in a northeastern suburb of Seattle, Washington and is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Lake Washington School District, encompassing suburbs of Redmond, Kirkland, Sammamish, and Juanita. The mission of Redmond High School is to provide an appropriately challenging academic experience for everyone, a school environment which values the contributions and aptitudes of each student, and a system of advocacy and instruction which connects every individual to the greater community and the opportunities waiting there.

Advanced Placement (AP)

Redmond High School offers 21 Advanced Placement classes. Students may enroll in as many AP classes as their high school schedule will accommodate. While most AP classes are offered every year, several others (such as AP Art History and AP European History) are typically offered every other year. In 2018, RHS students took 980 tests in 25 subject areas with 91.6% earning a grade of 3 or higher. The average score for the school on AP exams was 3.8. In addition, RHS had 57 AP Scholars, 42 AP Scholars with Honors, 98 AP Scholars with Distinction and 32 National AP Scholars.

Graduates must also meet standard on Washington State Assessment Requirements.

One-half credit is granted for satisfactory completion of each course that meets three periods per week for 50 minutes per period and one period per week for 78 minutes, for 18 weeks. A passing grade is a "D".
