Community

Redmond High School is located in a northeastern suburb of Seattle, Washington and is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Lake Washington School District, encompassing suburbs of Redmond, Kirkland, and Sammamish. One of the fastest growing areas in the state, Redmond is largely a middle to upper class community, formerly an agricultural and timber area, but now associated with rapidly expanding tech development.

Curriculum

Redmond High School is a four-year high school with an approximate total enrollment of 2,100 students. A class size limit of 32 exists for most class sections. Students have a number of courses from which to choose. Students can take advantage of Honors courses, Advanced Placement courses, Tech Prep (where students earn community college credit while enrolled in classes they take at Redmond High School), full or part-time enrollment in Running Start (a dual enrollment program where college courses are taken at local community colleges), college in the high school, and WANIC classes (both in and outside of Lake Washington School District).

Redmond High School offers 21 Advanced Placement classes and 11 Honors classes. Students may enroll in as many AP/Honors classes as their high school schedule will accommodate. While most AP classes are offered every year, several others are typically offered every other year. In 2019, RHS students took 1211 AP tests in 27 subject areas with 93% earning a grade of 3 or higher. The average score for RHS on AP exams was 4.1. In addition, RHS had 59 AP Scholars, 46 AP Scholars with Honors, 143 AP Scholars with Distinction and 46 National AP Scholars.

Students must have a minimum of 24 credits. which must include the following required courses for the class of 2020:

One-half credit is granted for satisfactory completion of each semester course that meets three periods per week for 50 minutes per period and one period per week for 78 minutes, for 18 weeks. A passing grade is a "D".
